Transitional Housing for Veterans

Long-term, structured environment designed to meet the unique needs of homeless veterans (Cleveland, Columbus, Dayton, Cincinnati, Sandusky)*

We provide a stable environment and help move veterans into independent housing through our supportive services. The Cincinnati, Cleveland and Dayton programs have 50 beds each. The Columbus program has 40 beds. The Sandusky program has 8 beds. Services include: case management, life skills training and referrals to community resources. We also offer treatment programs.

Emergency Housing for Veterans

Short-term, structured environment designed to meet the unique needs of homeless veterans (Columbus)

We provide a stable environment and quickly reintegrate veterans into employment and/or independent housing through our supportive services. Veterans are eligible to stay for up to 90 days in this 15-bed program. Services include: case management, life skills training and referrals to community resources.

Treatment Programs for Veterans

Programs for recovery from drug and alcohol addiction, and those with mental illness or dual diagnoses (Cleveland, Columbus)*

Integrated with the transitional housing program, we provide treatment programs for veteran's unique needs. We serve those with a chronic mental illness, who have an alcohol or drug addiction, or are dual diagnosed. Whatever their needs, we help them develop a plan for successful return to work and independent living. In Cleveland we offer mental health treatment and in Columbus we offer both mental health and substance abuse treatment.

Permanent Housing for Veterans

Veteran only apartment complex to stabilize and strengthen the community (Columbus)

We provide quality permanent housing solutions for veterans transitioning out of homelessness. There are currently 12 units available in Columbus that are available to veterans with HUD-VASH housing vouchers.

Veteran Employment Services

Job-readiness and training services to help veterans find and maintain suitable employment (Cincinnati, Cleveland, Columbus, Dayton)

The goal for each veteran is self-sufficiency through long-term employment. Services offered during the year-long program include: job-readiness skill development; résumé writing; job searching, placement and coaching; career clothing; transportation; and referrals to community resources.

Veterans & Families FIRST

*Wrap-around supportive services for veterans and their families who are currently homeless or at risk of becoming homeless (Cleveland, Columbus**, Dayton)*

Recognizing the importance of family and the lasting impact that homelessness or the threat of homelessness can have on a veteran and their family, we provide case management support to link a veteran and their family to community resources. Through this program we aim to keep families whole and in stable housing.

Veterans Domiciliary at Wade Park

*An all-encompassing approach to veteran homelessness, health and well-being (Cleveland**)*

A 122-bed state of the art residential care facility that combines rehabilitative medical services with supportive services for homeless veterans. This program is a partnership between Volunteers of America and the Cleveland VA Medical Center.
